
Annual Day Celebration 2025 - "Amrit Dharohar"

The resource person for the session was Mr. Shubhobroto Ghosh, *Wildlife Campaign Manager, World Animal Protection India*, assisted by Ms. Roopkatha Gupta, *Digital Media Officer*. The speakers sensitised students to the importance of animal welfare, its deep connection with human wellbeing and the ethical responsibilities we share toward all living beings. As part of the activity, students were encouraged to design posters portraying the condition of elephants in the wild and to write letters to the Hon'ble Prime Minister urging a ban on cruel elephant rides at Amer Fort. The top five entries in the poster-making competition and the best letters were awarded prizes, while certificates will be given to all participants. The programme formed a significant part of the school's ongoing collaboration with World Animal Protection to sensitise young minds and nurture compassionate, responsible and aware citizens capable of addressing critical environmental and ethical challenges in the future.



Class VII – Experiential Learning (Role-Play)




Class VIII – Art-Integrated Learning Topic-The Diary of a Young Girl

In Class VIII, the chapter The Diary of a Young Girl was introduced through an experiential and art-integrated approach to help students truly connect with Anne Frank's world. Instead of merely reading the text, learners first explored the historical backdrop of World War II, the rise of Nazism and the persecution of Jewish families through timelines, maps and visual aids. Students then created artistic posters depicting key events of WWII and symbols of peace and human rights. To step into Anne's shoes, they wrote heartfelt diary entries, imagining themselves living through fear, uncertainty and yet, unwavering hope—just as Anne once did. These activities enabled students to connect emotionally with the narrative, fostering empathy, historical awareness and creative expression. The hands-on approach made the study of Anne Frank deeply meaningful and unforgettable.

Subject Enrichment Activities

SCIENCE

Class VI – Life Cycles of Living Creatures

As part of the chapter Living Creatures, the students of Class VI explored the fascinating life processes of the mosquito, silkworm and frog. With the help of preserved specimens and visual aids, they closely observed each stage of these organisms' life cycles—from egg to adult. They studied the mosquito's development through egg, larva, pupa and adult stages, the silkworm's transformation from egg to larva, cocoon and moth, and the frog's remarkable metamorphosis from tadpole to adult. After their observations, students prepared presentations explaining each life cycle, discussed diseases such as malaria and dengue and suggested preventive measures.



Class VII – Exploring Curved Mirrors

In Chapter Light, the students of Class VII carried out an engaging hands-on activity using a simple household object—a spoon—to investigate the behaviour of curved mirrors. By observing their reflections on the inner and outer surfaces of the spoon at varying distances, they discovered how images can appear enlarged, diminished, erect or inverted. This simple yet effective activity helped them clearly understand the properties of concave and convex mirrors and their real-life applications in torches, vehicle headlights and security mirrors.




Subject Enrichment Activities

SCIENCE

Class VIII – Demonstration of Electrolysis of Water

The students of Class VIII conducted a practical activity to prepare a working model demonstrating the electrolysis of water. Using basic materials such as graphite electrodes, wires, a battery and a water container, they assembled the setup and observed the decomposition of water into hydrogen and oxygen gases. They recorded changes at each electrode and compared the volumes of gases produced. Following the demonstration, students discussed practical applications of electrolysis, including metal extraction, purification and industrial processes like electroplating. The activity significantly strengthened their understanding of chemical decomposition and the transformation of electrical energy into chemical change.

CLASS: I

ART INTEGRATED CUM EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

ACTIVITY: SHAPE UP! EXPLORING CREATIVITY WITH BASIC SHAPES

Students of class I explored the world of shapes by creating various objects using the four basic shapes: square, rectangle, triangle, and circle. The outcome was a delightful array of sceneries, vehicles and characters, each showcasing the students' creativity and understanding of shape recognition. Through this hands-on activity, students developed essential skills such as problem-solving, critical thinking, and spatial awareness. They also learned to identify and apply shapes in real-life contexts, making math more relatable and fun. The activity not only reinforced shape recognition but also encouraged students to think outside the box, literally!



CLASS: II

ART INTEGRATED LEARNING

ACTIVITY: TIME: THE STORY OF MY DAY

Learning to tell time turned into a fun storytelling session. Each child created a "story of their day" by sequencing daily events — from waking up in the morning to going to bed at night, like "I eat breakfast at 8 o'clock" or "I play at 5 o'clock." They sequenced their daily routines and matched each event with the correct time using DIY colorful clocks. This engaging activity helped children to connect time concepts to real life, making learning both meaningful and enjoyable.

CLASS: III


ART INTEGRATED LEARNING

ACTIVITY: ADJECTIVE FLOWER



As part of enhancing descriptive language skills, a delightful activity called Adjective Flower was conducted in Class 3. The task involved drawing a flower with a central circle labeled "Mom" or "Dad" and filling each petal with adjectives that best described their parents. Words like generous, hardworking and adventurous showcased the students' growing vocabulary and ability to use descriptive language meaningfully. This

activity not only enhanced the students' understanding of adjectives but also encouraged them to express gratitude and affection towards their parents. The activity helped students connect emotionally while practicing their language skills. It encouraged them to think critically about the qualities of their parents and express these through well-chosen adjectives. This hands-on task proved to be an engaging way to develop vocabulary, creativity and emotional expression.



CLASS: III

ART INTEGRATED LEARNING

ACTIVITY: ADJECTIVES: SLIDE-A-CRITTER

Students explored the concept of adjectives through a creative hands-on activity. Each child chose an insect—such as a butterfly, bee, ladybug, or caterpillar—and drew or pasted it on an A-4 sheet. They then added a sliding paper strip that revealed different adjectives describing their insect, like small, colourful, tiny, and shiny. Through this activity, students not only understood how adjectives describe a noun but also developed important skills such as creative expression, fine motor skills, vocabulary building, and clear visual presentation. It also encouraged them to think independently and choose suitable describing words for their insect.


CLASS: III

ART INTEGRATED CUM EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

ACTIVITY: CAPACITY CATERPILLAR



The students participated in a fun Capacity Caterpillar activity to understand the concept of capacity (ml and L). Each segment of the caterpillar represented a different measurement, and students labelled them using units like 100 ml, 250 ml, 500 ml, and 1 L. Through drawing, coloring, and arranging the caterpillar's body parts in order, students learned to compare capacities and understand which containers hold more or less. The activity supported AIL through creative artwork and EL by allowing students to learn capacity through hands-on representation. It made the topic enjoyable, visual, and easy to remember.




CLASS: III

ACTIVITY: SOIL TEXTURE ART

They mixed colors and textures, experimenting with different soil types. The clay soil was sticky and moldable, while the sand added a nice crunch. As they worked, they learned about the unique properties of each soil type. The finished artwork was a stunning display of creativity and texture. Students' Personality Development Program (SPDP)

Students' Personality Development Program was conducted in November on 'Anger Management'. Anger management was introduced through e-modules and stories. Teachers discussed its meaning, importance and objectives. General discussions took place on how to control anger and adopt management techniques. Various activities were organized to teach this vital life skill. Additionally, some tips were provided to help manage anger. An activity was conducted in the classrooms to help students distinguish between controllable and uncontrollable triggers of anger. The students gained an understanding of the importance of tolerance. Different strategies for handling situations that lead to anger and ways to control it were discussed. Students participated in a group discussion about the negative effects of aggression. They were also asked to create an "Anger Thermometer," which included different levels of anger, ways they express anger and appropriate responses for each situation. This activity helped students distinguish between acceptable and unacceptable behaviour and promoted self-control. Moreover, the students realized that some anger-triggering situations can be avoided, while others can be ignored, ultimately leading to effective anger management. This activity was a key first step in helping students control and regulate their anger and emotions. Activities such as Pick Me Out, What Do I Feel When I Get Angry? When Do I Get Angry? Anger Record and Let's Walk Together were conducted for students. The students shared their experiences and drew images of their feelings when angry.
