VAN MAHOTSAVA CELEBRATION (1ST -7TH JULY, 2021)

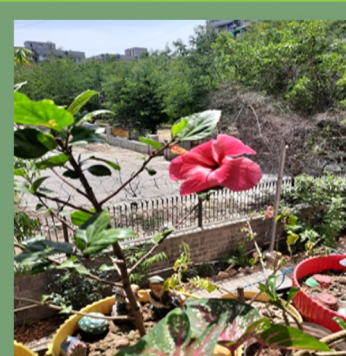
Save the trees, Save the Earth, We are the guardians of nature's birth'

Class III: Make a collage presenting the different ways by which we should take care of our green friends- plants.

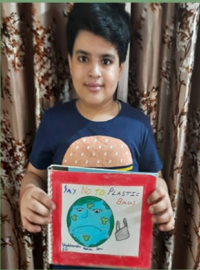
Class IV and V: Click a picture of you taking care of a plant and write a catchy slogan to save trees on the picture.

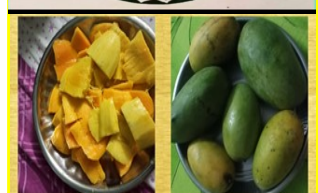
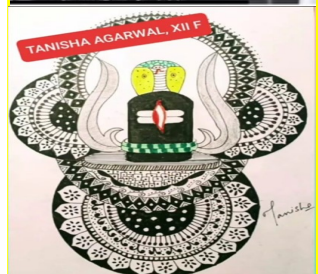
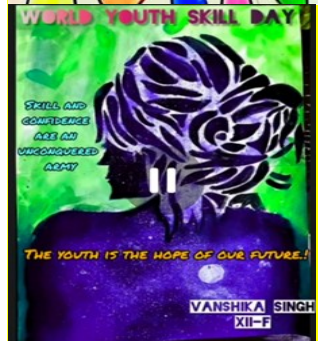
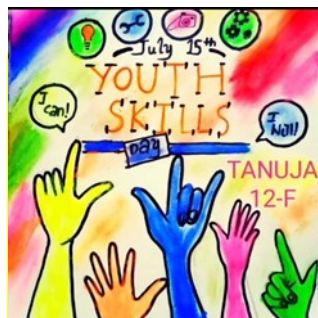


INTERNATIONAL PLASTIC BAG FREE DAY (3RD JULY, 2021)

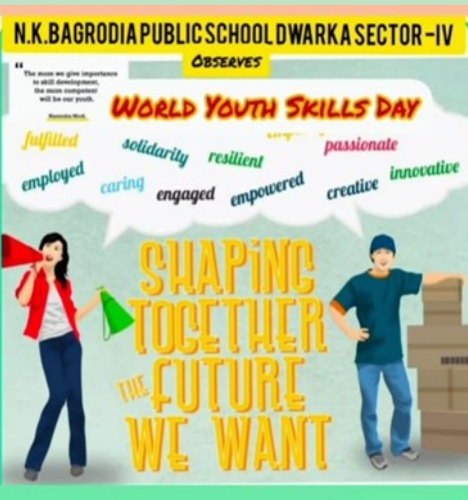




"WORLD YOUTH SKILLS DAY" 19 JULY 2021

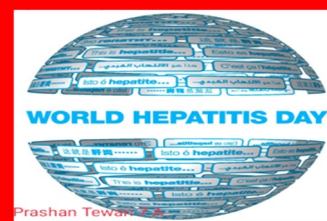
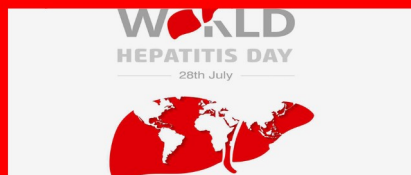




WORLD HEPATITIS DAY -28TH JULY 2021

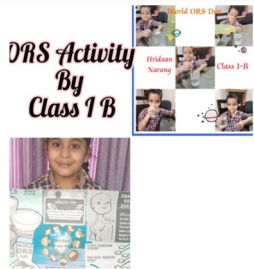

World ORS (Oral Rehydration Solution) Day is observed annually on 29th July to raise awareness about using ORS, as a safe and effective measure to prevent and treat dehydration and related deaths especially in infants and children. Oral Rehydration Solution or Salt (ORS) is rightly called as “The Amrut in Dehydration” since it serves as an elixir to treat the severe health complications caused by diarrhea in children below 5 years of age. The main theme of World ORS day 2021 is “Oral Rehydration, No More Dehydration”, which reinforces the importance of Oral Rehydration Therapy (ORT) as an effective tool against dehydration and diarrhea. July 19th 2021-

The speaker of the session was Ms Namita Upadhyay, a motivational speaker, Art of Living, Lucknow. The theme of the session was 'What is the desired objectives of students from their lives'. The speaker began the session highlighting the essentials of a student's life. The students came up with certain answers such as "good marks", "better concentration", "less fatigue" and "more physical play". This helped the children in getting better in terms of using both hands simultaneously. The students took a great interest in all the activities with full zeal. The session also witnessed a fulfilled foot tapping chicken dance which was wholeheartedly enjoyed by all the kids. The session comprised of 150 attendees, thus providing a unique opportunity for the young kids to understand the valuable traits required in the student's life.

July 26th 2021-

The speaker of the session was Ms. Deepa Mehra- a health and wellness coach. The theme of the session was 'Vitality of Staying Healthy'. The speaker greeted & appreciated the contribution of the institution in inculcating the good moral values in the students apart from the academic skills. She talked about the inevitability of being an early riser and to exercise daily. Miss Mehra guided the children to inhale fresh air and to follow a routine breathing exercises. The speaker displayed some aerobics exercises post her verbal session. She made the young students perform aerobics on different songs of Bollywood, Hollywood & even traditional Bhangra. MULTI MODAL TEACHING LEARNING

Multimodal teaching-learning suggests teaching-learning of concepts using multiple modes and where a number of our senses- visual, auditory, kinesthetic- are being engaged during learning; making understanding better. By combining these modes, learners experience learning in a variety of ways to create a diverse learning style. This method of teaching-learning is adopted in our classes and the advantages gained through these multiple learning strategies help the students to learn more quickly and improve their attention span.

Some of the activities conducted during online classes include-

Order of Numbers (Mathematics) - In this activity, students formed a 'Family Ladder' by arranging the photos of their family members in ascending and descending order according to their ages. With the help of colorful sketch pens, they decorated the ladders and wrote the age in between the ladders. The objective of the activity was to make the students recall number, order and positions and to make them learn the arrangement of numbers in a sequence in a fun way

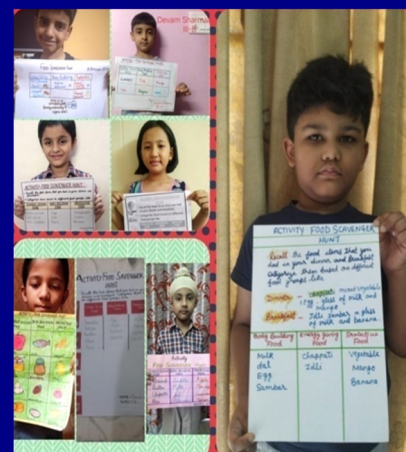
Story-telling on Place Value with Ice-cream sticks (Mathematics) Place value is an important math concept for early elementary students to understand. They need to learn that the value of a digit depends on its place in a number. In order to help the students understand place value, a story was narrated with manipulatives to show the value of each digit. For this, ice-cream sticks and place value houses were used. Manipulatives were used to explicitly teach students how to compose a number. Using the ice-cream sticks, the students created a multi-digit number by showing the value of each digit separately. Students also made groups in appropriate columns on their own place value houses to make a number. This activity helped students to understand the concept in an easy and interesting manner.

Arty-crafty Articles (English) - Art Integrated Learning is a teaching learning model which is based on learning 'through the arts' and 'with the arts'. It is a process where art becomes the medium of teaching-learning, a key to understanding the concepts with age appropriate opportunities for learners. The students participated in this activity enthusiastically based on the topic Articles by showing the perfect integration of art and craft with English language.

My bunch of collective nouns (English) - "Languages are Caught, NOT Taught"

One of the joys of teaching is when students' faces light up with excitement and learning becomes fun. The purpose of English activity on collective nouns was to help the children think 'beyond the box' by adopting the Art Integrated Learning approach. Students created magnificent collective nouns bouquets and baskets.

Food scavenger hunt (E.V.S) - Using games and activities is a great way to help children learn about healthy eating while having fun at the same time. This idea was used to engage children in healthy eating experiences, teach them to recognize different kinds of foods and encourage them to experiment with new foods, tastes, flavors and textures. This activity stimulated sensory perception in our little Bagrodians since childhood is a time of curiosity and discovery in terms of food. Also, the students were asked to make a list of food items they had in their meals of a day and then they categorized those food items in three different food groups.

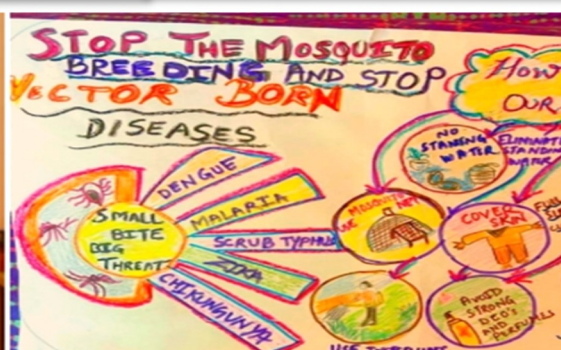
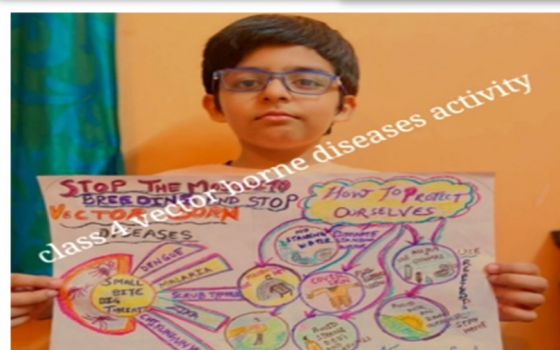
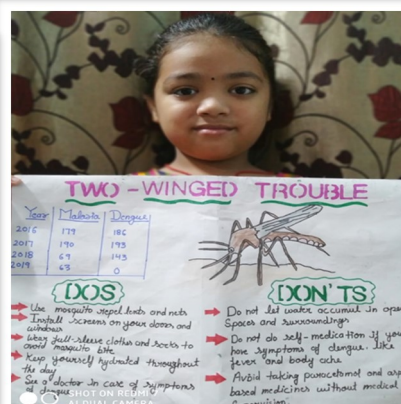
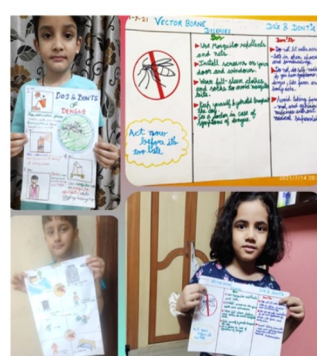
ment academics and give the students' practical training which they require in day-to-day life. In our school, various club activities are organized giving an opportunity to the students to develop their talent and hone their skills.

ANTI - DENGUE MONTH

The onset of monsoon not only brings relief from heat but also triggers favourable chances of mosquito breeding. In order to spread awareness about dengue and other vector borne diseases, July month is observed as 'Anti-Dengue Month'. They were given a general view on how vector-borne diseases spread and how they can become an epidemic. The children were exposed to the very concept of how these diseases are life threatening by showing relevant videos. They were advised to take preventive measures by keeping the surroundings neat and clean, keeping check on stagnant water, wearing full sleeves clothes while going out and keeping the surroundings mosquito free as much as possible. The students also demonstrated the ways of prevention and elimination of vector borne diseases through posters and slogans. Wearing full-sleeves shirts and long pants.

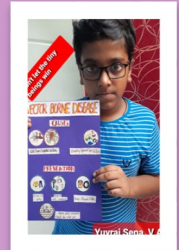
#Using mosquito repellents.

A living organism which carries/transmits a pathogenic (disease causing) agent into a healthy organism is called a vector and the diseases transmitted by such organisms are called vector borne diseases.

Some examples of vector borne diseases are malaria, dengue, chikungunya, kala azar, Japanese encephalitis etc. which are transmitted by mosquitoes. Dengue is transmitted by female Aedes Malaria is transmitted by female Anopheles mosquito, house fly, sand fly(transmits kala azar) and several other insects.

These diseases(particularly malaria and dengue) continue to have a staggering effect on human population.

Unfortunately, even today India is one of the many countries where such diseases are on a rise. The various reasons behind this are: poor sanitation, less awareness amongst people, environmental factors, etc.

Prevention of vector born diseases:

- Wear light coloured, long sleeved clothes and trousers to protect yourselves from insect bites
- Sleep under an insecticide treated bed net. If you are living in an area with high risk of malaria.
- Use insect repellent on exposed parts of your body and clothes.
- Make sure that your household and neighborhood is clean i.e. there is no garbage and do not allow water to be accumulated anywhere.
- Spread awareness regarding vector born diseases.

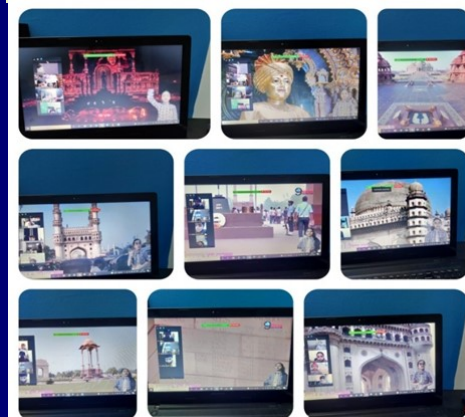
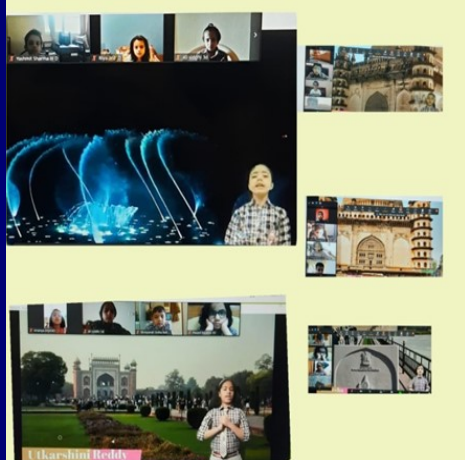

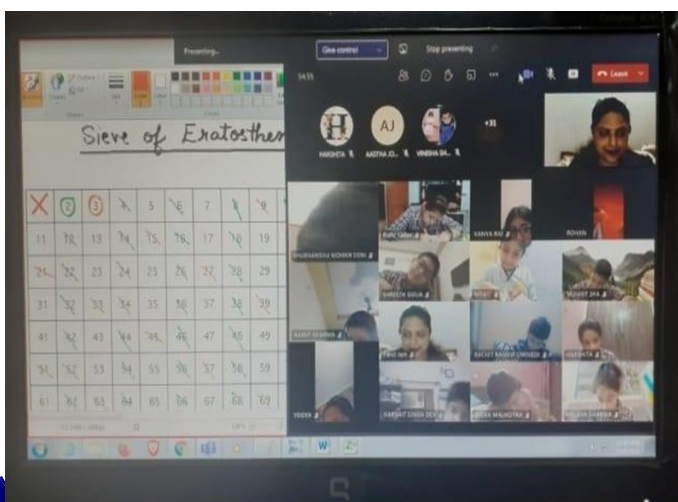
Social Studies

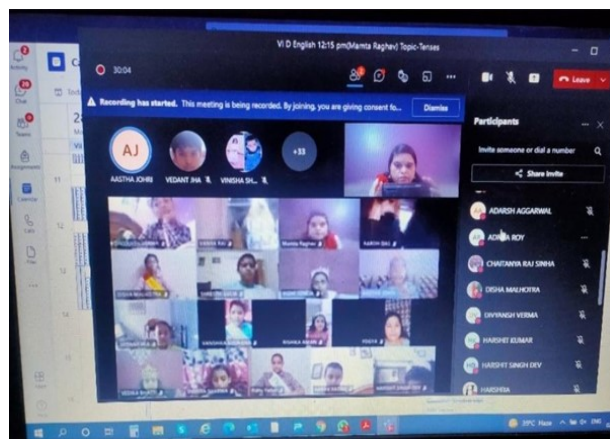
Mathematics

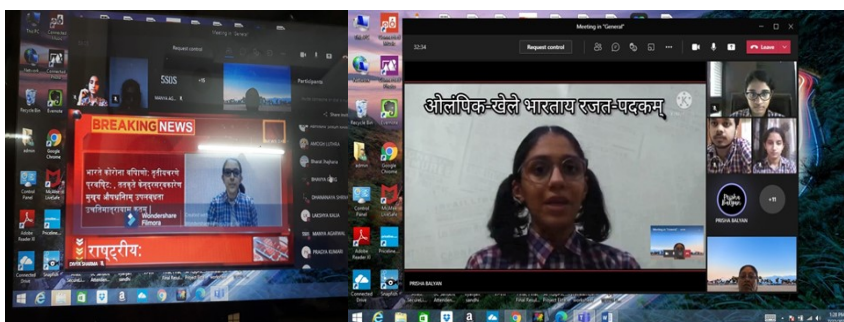
Science

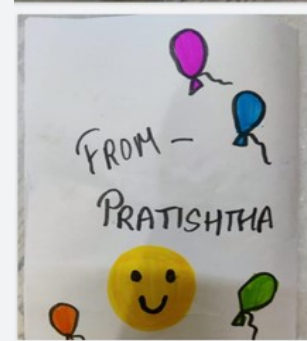
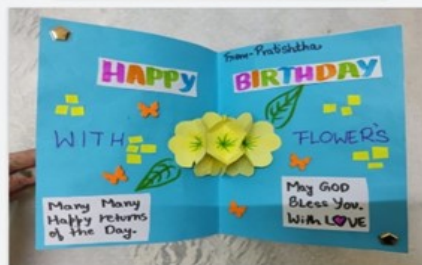
Sanskrit

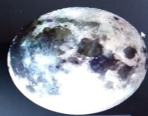

1) “The Story of Helium, Beyond Balloons”- an amazing webinar was organised for students of classes IX and X on 10th July, 2021. The webinar was organised by the team of Nehru Planetarium.

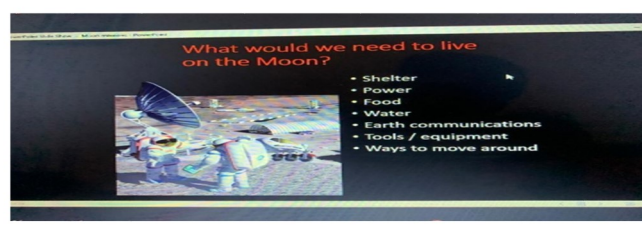
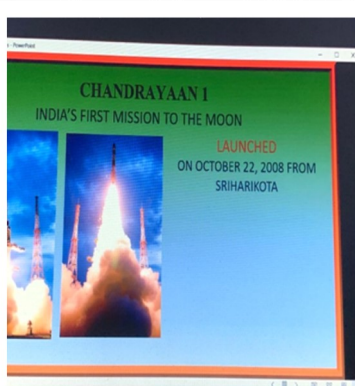
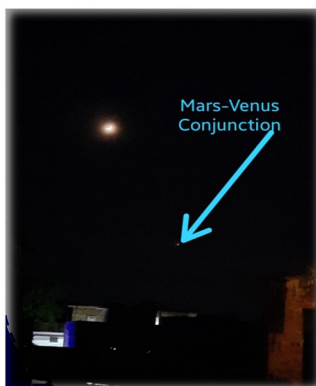
The Workshop began with paying homage to Dr N. Rathnashree, the director of Nehru Planetarium. She was an institution in herself and was enthusiastic for her work. Her knowledge brightened the futures of many students. The resource person Dr. Tripti Kumari started the session by explaining the Avogadro law. She also told the students about the different isotopes of Helium. For various reasons, the helium industry is currently in a state of flux and medical and scientific users of the gas are concerned about future supply problems – which some worry could be exacerbated by “frivolous” uses of helium such as in balloons. The Big Bang and Nuclear fusion were extensively mentioned. The Manhattan Project and Cold War were also briefly explained. The surprising features of Helium – The gas that wouldn’t burn and it is superfluid in nature.

2) “Conjunction of Mars- Venus- Moon”- A YouTube Talk was organised on 13th July, 2021 for the secondary wing. The resource person was Dr Chiranjib Konar from Amity University.

Dr Chiranjib Konar discussed about Mars and Venus, two of the Earth's closest neighbours – which came close to each other in the sky on Monday, that is, on 12th July 2021 & Tuesday, July 13, 2021. This rare celestial treat gave a chance to all-sky gazers to watch these planets with naked eyes after the sunset in the western sky. On these dates, Mars and Venus appeared to be just 0.5° of each other from Earth. However, while the two planets on either side of Earth’s orbit appeared to be closest on that date, they looked almost as close in a few nights before and after with the added bonus of a super-slim crescent moon in presence. That made it a “triple conjunction” and one that was an eye catcher. It appeared as a line-of-sight illusion since the planets are millions of miles apart, but they looked close together for a few nights.

3) “Back to the Moon: from Neil Armstrong to Chandrayaan- 2”- A webinar was organised by Nehru Planetarium on 22nd July, 2021 for the students of classes IX and X. The resource person was Dr Mila Mitra, co-founder and academic

“A small step for man could be a giant leap for mankind”: it was with these words that Neil Armstrong became the first person to set foot on the Moon 52 years ago, on July 20th, 1969. It is the most renowned occasion celebrated by space enthusiasts globally. Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin created history, and, on the eve of India’s second lunar mission – Chandrayaan 2. Thus, to celebrate July month as a “Moon carnival”, Planetarium organized an online webinar for school students to share the fantastic leap of Human over space science.
